



To Whom It May Concern:

It has come to our attention that Aline Heat Seal of Cerritos, California has been accepting deposits and in some cases full prepayment for machines and spare parts for machines that they are incapable of building.

In an effort to prevent any further deposits being fraudulently accepted by this company we are providing the following order history and contact information to an Aline customer who has agreed to assist us in this difficult matter.

Interplast S.A. of Medellin, Colombia submitted an order for one STS-7 analog tube sealer to Aline Heat Seal in November of 2011 which had a lead time of 6-10 weeks. This order was confirmed by Aline on November, 20 2012 and as of this writing 7/25/2013 it has yet to be delivered. Upon requesting updated delivery dates, Aline's president and order processing personnel fabricated information on delay including receiving parts from vendors, cash flow issues, and a merger with my company. The only true part of the statements was cash flow issues and we NEVER indicated we would be interested in a merger with a company with such a huge amount of debt.

My company stepped in and offered to manufacture an identical STS-7 analog tube sealer with our parts and technicians and offered a lead time of 2-3 weeks, upon receiving confirmation of funds the machine build started. In less than one week, when Daniel Cardenas asked if we had received the funds and when we could expect to start the machine *we instead provided him with a FedEx tracking number showing that the machine had already shipped!*
